

## Why You Shouldn't Pour Grease Down Your Drains!

Hot grease may seem like an easy fluid to pour down a drain, but as it cools down, it hardens and forms a clog that can be hard to remove. Even if you don't notice it, grease buildup in your pipes can cause blockages and other plumbing issues later on.

If the grease flows into the sewers instead of sticking to the pipes, it can cause even bigger problems. All the oil from households and restaurants in the area combines, forming fatty acids and glycerol over time.

The fatty acids react with calcium in the sewers to form fatbergs, which are soap-like compounds. When the sewer level rises, the fatbergs cling to the sewer ceilings and grow in size, eventually clogging the whole pipe. The size of the fatberg can grow as much as the sewer can accommodate.

To liquefy the grease in your pipes, you can pour boiling water down the drain and run the hot water tap to flush out the melted fat. You should also pour dish soap down the drain with the boiling water, as surfactant molecules help to emulsify oil and water. While hot water and dish soap may help remove the grease from your pipes, it will still end up in the sewer system.
