Budget Proposal Presentation

Overview

Barrett Brown presented the current budget, noting that revenue is tracking closely to projections, but expenditures are under due to staffing vacancies. He proposed a 3% cost-of-living increase and a 2% merit raise for staff, a \$500 monthly stipend for fire department volunteers, and modest increases for IT, streets and grounds, and Parks and Recreation. The police department needs funding for staff and facility improvements. The redevelopment corporation's rents were raised, and the town will review utility payments. The board discussed prioritizing street repairs and the importance of maintaining community events and board member stipends.

Action Items

- - Consolidate departmental priorities and board feedback into a formal revised budget proposal for the May board meeting.
- - Coordinate performance evaluations for all staff using the prior manager-evaluation scoring approach and apply merit salary increases only to those employees who meet the quantitative criteria.
- - Review the redevelopment of the building rent and utility payment structure to confirm whether the town's annual utility budget line is redundant and propose how any freed-up funds could be reallocated.
- - Email the board a draft of the redevelopment building lease language that was referenced during the meeting.
- - Ensure the necessary documents for the upcoming weekend event are copied and distributed to attendees before they leave.
- Obtain updated cost and technical numbers from KC on the proposed UV disinfection and slurry-based pH-balancing treatment for the water line and provide that information to Barrett Brown.
- Once the Parks and Recreation allocation is finalized, issue the requested four-person passes for the pool and related programs to each board member and their designated guests.
- After finalizing details of the Mountain Heat Elementary parade, share the parade date, time, and location with the board members.

Outline

Budget Overview and Initial Proposals

- Barrett Brown begins the meeting by thanking everyone and outlining the budget as it currently stands, noting that the board members should have a copy of the budget.
- Barrett mentions that the revenue is close to projections, but it is under expenditure due to staffing vacancies and controlled spending.
- He suggests some moderate increases in certain areas and invites feedback from the board members on their interests and concerns.
- Barrett proposes a 3% cost of living increase and a 2% merit raise for administration salaries, based on individual evaluations.

Detailed Budget Proposals for Departments

- Barrett discusses the IT technology budget, noting an uptick due to relocating and upgrading cameras and connecting them to the pool house.
- He mentions a small increase for streets and grounds to support road paving efforts and beautification, including maintenance of pots and signage.
- Barrett proposes a moderate increase for Parks and Recreation programming and a salary adjustment for the summer camp, acknowledging the stagnant salary.
- For the police department, Barrett suggests funding for staff positions and facility improvements to enhance public safety.

Fire Department and Redevelopment Corporation Budget

- Barrett highlights the need for funding for the fire department, including staff positions and facility improvements, noting that expenditures have exceeded projections due to fire calls.
- He proposes a stipend of \$300 to \$500 a month for fire department staff to compensate for managing volunteers and maintaining licenses.
- Barrett discusses the Redevelopment Corporation's budget, noting that the town pays all utilities for the businesses and that the rents have been raised based on square footage and placement.
- He mentions the need to divide utility meters to allow businesses to pay for their own electricity, which would require changes in the rent structure.

Community Events and Board Member Stipends

- Barrett proposes a modest increase in support for training and development, providing for community events, and a stipend for board members.
- He suggests raising the stipend for board members to \$200, noting that this is the only board in the county that offers monthly installments.
- Barrett mentions that other towns offer insurance to board members as an option, which could be considered for this board.

Streets and Sidewalks Maintenance

- The discussion shifts to streets and sidewalks maintenance, with Wahoo identifying three main streets in need of repair.
- Barrett explains that the town receives power bill money every year, which can be used for street and sidewalk repairs.

- The board members discuss the importance of spending the power bill to maintain the town's growth and avoid questions from the state.
- They agree to prioritize spending the money this year to ensure optics and address the most critical repairs.

Parks and Recreation and Other Budget Items

- Barrett confirms that the county will provide money for the park program, as they have in the past, despite some concerns about pulling back on funding.
- He mentions that the request for qualifications for the new town hall and the pocket park will start soon, with work expected to begin over the summer.
- The board discusses the need for new Christmas lights and the possibility of buying some this year to phase them in overtime.
- Barrett notes that the town has not proposed a property tax increase or a water and sewer rate increase, and any rate increases would come from fees.

New Town Hall and Other Announcements

- Barrett announces that the town will be moving into the new town hall next week, with furniture and equipment already in place.
- He mentions that the conference room is larger and more private, and the building has been rekeyed and coded for security.
- The board members discuss the importance of community events and the need for board members to support them, including the Mount Gilead Elementary Gator Parade.
- Barrett encourages board members to reach out to him with any additional concerns or suggestions for the budget.

Ordinance _____

AN ORDINANCE DIRECTING THE CODE ADMINISTRATOR TO REMOVE OR DEMOLISH THE PROPERTY HEREIN DESCRIBED AS UNFIT FOR HUMAN HABITATION AND DIRECTING THAT A NOTICE BE PLACED THEREON THAT THE SAME MAY NOT BE OCCUPIED

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Mount Gilead finds that the structure described herein is unfit for human habitation under the Town Minimum Housing Code and that all of the procedures of the Minimum Housing Code have been complied with; and

WHEREAS, this structure should be removed or demolished as directed by the Code Administrator and should be placarded by placing thereon a notice prohibiting use for human habitation; and

WHEREAS, the owner of this structure has been given a reasonable opportunity to bring the structure up to the standards of the Minimum Housing Code in accordance with NCGS 160D, Article 12, and pursuant to an order issued by the Code Administrator on November 20, 2025, and the owner has failed to comply with the Order;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Mount Gilead, that:

Section 1. The owner of such building(s), dwelling(s) and premises is hereby ordered to vacate any occupants and/or personal property therein on or before **May 26, 2026**.

Section 2. The Code Administrator is hereby authorized and directed to place placards containing the legend:

"This building is unfit for human habitation. The use or occupation of this building for human habitation is prohibited and unlawful."

on the building located at the following address: **500 West Allenton Street (6593-15-73-1961)**

Section 3. The Code Administrator is hereby authorized and directed to proceed to remove or demolish the above described structure in accordance with his order to the owner thereof dated the 20th day of November 2025, and in accordance with the Minimum Housing Code and NCGS 160D, Article 12;

Section 4. (a) The cost of removal or demolition shall constitute a lien against the real property upon which the cost was incurred. The lien shall be filed in the office of the Clerk of the Court for Montgomery County, and shall have the same priority and be collected in the same manner as the lien for special assessments in Article 10 of NCGS Chapter 160A;

(b) Upon completion of the required removal or demolition, the Code Administrator shall sell the materials of the dwelling and credit the proceeds against the cost of removal or demolition. The Code Administrator shall certify the remaining balance to the Tax collector. If a surplus remains after the sale of the materials and satisfaction of the cost of removal or demolition, the Code Administrator shall deposit the surplus in the Superior Court where it shall be secured and disbursed in the manner provided by NCGS 160D-1203(7)c.

Section 5. It shall be unlawful for any person to remove or cause to be removed the placard from any building to which it is affixed. It shall likewise be unlawful for any person to occupy or to permit the occupancy of any building therein declared to be unfit for human habitation.

Section 6. This Ordinance shall become effective upon its adoption.

Subject: Proposal to Extend Social District Hours

Trilogy Books of 103 S Main Street—a newly licensed ABC permit holder serving beer and wine—respectfully submits this proposal to extend the current social district hours to better align with the operating hours of Main Street businesses and the timing of downtown events.

North Carolina law permits the sale and serving of alcohol on Monday through Saturday from 7am to 2am the following day, and on Sunday from 12pm to 2am the following day. Adjusting the social district hours within these legal limits would provide flexibility for participating businesses while remaining fully compliant with state regulations.

Standardizing and aligning social district hours with the hours that businesses are open and serving alcohol would also create clarity for customers around the rules of the social district. When social district hours match business operation hours, patrons can easily understand that beverages purchased from licensed businesses may be carried throughout the district and into other participating businesses. This consistency helps reduce confusion and minimizes the need for additional oversight and enforcement because the rules are clear.

The goal of the social district is to create a cohesive downtown atmosphere where people can walk between businesses, discover new shops, and enjoy community events. Extending social district hours to better match the operating hours of downtown businesses would strengthen the success of downtown events, increase foot traffic and customer dwell time, and create a more consistent and easily understood experience for visitors and customers.

The following table indicates the open hours of Main Street merchants that are licensed to serve alcohol (designated by bold) or allow alcoholic beverages purchased at a licensed establishment to be brought into their stores.

In addition, special events that require significant planning, coordination, and financial investment from downtown merchants would benefit from the expansion of social district hours. Aligning social district hours with these events would help maximize attendance and allow visitors to comfortably explore downtown while supporting multiple businesses.

These events are often held outside of normal business hours, such as starting at 9am on Saturdays, or extending until the late evening on a Friday night. Additionally, Cruise-Ins, which attract a significant number of visitors to our town, are held on the first Sunday (March to November) from 12pm to 4pm.

Therefore, I ask that you vote to adopt new social district hours of Monday to Saturday 9am to 11:59pm, and Sunday 12pm to 8pm, at the next Town Board meeting on May 5, 2026.

Town Manager Report

Board of Commissioners Meeting – May 2026

1. Budget Retreat: **Budget Retreat** is scheduled for **Friday April 17th at 6:00pm at the Fire Station.** Barrett Brown presented the current budget, noting that revenue is tracking closely to projections, but expenditure is under projections due to staff vacancies. He proposed a 3% cost-of-living increase and a 2% merit raise for staff, a \$300-\$500 stipend for volunteer fire chief, and modest increases for IT, streets and grounds, and Parks and Recreation. The police department needs funding for staff and facility improvements. The redevelopment corporation's rents were raised, and the town will review utility payments for the building that houses the tenants. The board discussed prioritizing street repairs and the importance of maintaining community events and board member stipends.

2. New Town Hall: Town Hall is moving from 110 W. Allenton St. to 207 N. Main St. Effective Thursday, April 28, water bills and most town business will be handled at the new location. The old building will keep a drop box (checked daily) for a few months and will have signage directing residents to the new Town Hall; website and social media updates will also be posted. Public Works will relocate into the old building. Phone numbers/extensions will transfer with no expected service interruption. A patriotic-themed Open House and Grand Opening to dedicate the new building and commemorate the 250th Anniversary of the Declaration of Independence is planned for the first week of July. Recommended administrative steps include posting the announcement, producing signage, updating directory listings, confirming mail forwarding, notifying vendors/utilities, communicating drop-box schedule, and preparing event logistics and staff

3. Redevelopment Corporation: A meeting was held on 4/17 to discuss the lease agreement for the Arts Studio. The tenants who have been there long-term are being asked to adhere to the 25-hour work requirement, which they want to waive. The board voted unanimously against granting any exceptions. Concerns from Mount Gilead Board of Commissioner Tim McCauley were conveyed to the board about the tenants receiving only 30 days' notice and suggesting expanding the board. The board also discussed the need for potential patio construction. The meeting concluded with a decision to keep the board at five members for now.

4. Albert Johnson “Pocket” Park: The meeting held 4/28 discussed the timeline for the Albert Johnson Park project, aiming for completion by November or early December. Key steps include identifying an et” Park electrical contractor by August. Construction could start in September, with a two-month completion timeline. The project

requires three bids, and a backup plan is in place if fewer bids are received. Local contractors and electricians were recommended for work. Monthly meetings and bi-weekly updates were proposed to ensure transparency.

10. Social District

This section explains the difference between state alcohol sale/service hours and the Town’s Social District consumption rules so businesses, patrons, and enforcement staff understand when alcohol may be sold and when it may be carried/consumed in the public social district.

State law — Sale and service (N.C. law)

- Citation: N.C. Gen. Stat. § 18B-100.
- Authorized sale/service hours for licensed establishments:
 - Monday–Saturday: 7:00 AM – 2:00 AM (following day)
 - Sunday: 12:00 PM – 2:00 AM (following day)
- Local option: the Town may authorize sales beginning at 10:00 AM on Sunday if it chooses.

Town policy — Social District consumption (public open containers)

- **Adopted: January 2025.**
- Social District consumption hours (public streets within the district):
 - Monday–Saturday: 2:00 PM – 9:00 PM
- Applies only within the designated Social District boundaries and only to beverages purchased from participating, permitted businesses.
- Participation requires the business to be duly permitted to sell alcoholic beverages and enrolled in the Social District program.

- Different scopes: State law controls when businesses may sell/serve alcohol inside their licensed premises. Town policy controls when/where alcohol may be carried and consumed on public property within the Social District.

- No conflict: The Town's Social District hours do not prevent a licensed business from selling alcohol during state-permitted hours; they only limit public consumption/open containers on Town property to the Social District hours stated above.
- Enforcement focus: License compliance (sales) remains under NC ABC and local licensing rules; public consumption/open container enforcement within the district follows Town policy and local enforcement practices.

Practical guidance for businesses and patrons

- A business may sell alcohol during state-permitted sale hours regardless of Social District hours, subject to its ABC license and local licensing requirements.
 - Patrons may carry and consume beverages in the Social District only during the Town's designated consumption hours and only if the beverage was purchased from a participating, permitted establishment.
 - Outside Social District hours, open container rules on public property apply and public consumption may be prohibited or enforceable under Town ordinances.

Garden

Garden Report for Town Board – Mount Gilead Community Garden

This reporting period focused on restoring core infrastructure, preparing for the growing season, and addressing both short-term needs and long-term planning within the garden.

Volunteer engagement remains steady. Mary, Monika, and Jennifer led recent work sessions, and we also had participation from Sheldon Poplin Morley and his daughter, who assisted with planting efforts. During this session, we planted American chestnut hybrids with blight resistance and a kumquat tree, both donated by Allen Morrill. These additions contribute to the long-term viability and diversity of the orchard.

The most significant operational update is that irrigation has been fully restored. The Town's maintenance crew repaired the primary water line feeding the site, which allowed us to bring all downstream irrigation lines back online. At this point, the system is functioning end to end. Minor adjustments to sprinkler heads remain, but full water access has been reestablished, which removes a major constraint heading into planting season.

Site preparation is well underway. The main production beds have been cleared and weeded, and soil is being turned in advance of planting. Pathways are also being restored to manageable condition. These early-season efforts are critical to reducing maintenance burden later and improving overall yield.

We added a giant sequoia as a companion planting to the existing Moon Tree. While it will not reach its full native scale in this climate, it serves as a long-term investment in the landscape and educational value of the space. The Moon Tree itself continues to recover from last year's poisoning incident. The primary leader was lost, and the tree is now establishing a new leader. It remains viable but will require continued monitoring as its structure develops.

There are also some losses and likely replacements to report within the orchard. One peach tree has not recovered sufficiently from prior damage and is expected to be replaced. A fig tree is also underperforming and may require replacement depending on how it progresses in the coming weeks. These decisions are being made based on plant health and long-term productivity rather than preservation of compromised specimens.

The orchard area requires additional work, specifically fencing and cleanup. Materials for standard pole fencing are already on site, but installation is labor-dependent, and current volunteer capacity is not sufficient to complete this efficiently without additional help.

Accessibility improvements have been added to the active project list. Based on community input, we will be constructing a wheelchair accessible raised bed to ensure broader participation in the garden. This will be integrated into the layout as a permanent feature.

The garden is on track for planting. We are past frost, irrigation is operational, and rented beds are ready for use. Seeds and crops will begin going in over the next week.

To support volunteer participation, workdays are being shifted from Saturday mornings to Thursday evenings at 5 PM. This change is intended to improve accessibility for those unable to attend weekend sessions.

Overall, the garden has moved from recovery and repair into active seasonal readiness, with infrastructure stabilized and planting imminent. Continued volunteer support will be the primary factor in maintaining momentum, particularly for orchard fencing and ongoing maintenance.
